The 'social impact' section is one place where you nicely set the stage for broader impact you've had, and you should consider exposition at a similar level for all the other sections.

To give you an idea of what I mean, attached is some stuff I needed to put together 2 years ago -- for the department chair to extract excepts to use in this letter for my nomination for a chaired professorship. I think you can easily put something like this together. In short, elevate the discussion a notch before jumping into technical details. Folks want you to make their life's as easy as possible when writing letters. Keep that at the forefront when you are writing your impact summary.

The MITRE ATT&CK framework is in essence a collection of attack signatures. It is embarrassing for major US authorities like Chris to come out in public and say that Iran will be using attack methods that have not only been identified historically from US analysts, but they are also available to be seen in the public domain.

That is, if the Iranians are truly tying to do something sophisticated, by definition, will be different than what they have done in the past. Therefore, looking at the MITRE framework for *detection and remediation* is effectively and practically useless.

While I did not comment on his comment, in various private lists/channels I am serious technical people are making fun of these recommendations.
